

STUFF YOU NEED:


MATERIALS

1/4 yard of orange faux fur
1/4 yard of pink felt
Fabric batting
Orange thread
Pink thread
Headband
Orange ribbon

TOOLS



Pen/marker
Needle and thimble
Scissors
X-ACTO® Knife
Pins
Hot glue gun or regular glue







STEP 1 — Print and Cut

- Print out the pattern pieces.
- Use the scissors to cut out each shape.





STEP 2 — Trace Pattern for Outer Ears

- Fold the orange fabric, pressing the furry sides together.
- On the back of the fabric, trace both the right and the left ear patterns.
- Use the X-ACTO® blade to cut the ears out, using the line as your guide.
- Set the ears aside. You should have four pieces total (a front and a back for each ear).





STEP 3 — Cut Inner Ears

- Pin the inner ear templates to the pink fabric.
- Cut out the inner ear pieces. You should have two.





STEP 4 — Pin and Sew the Ears

- Pin the inner ears to the furry side of outer ears (two total).
- Sew the edges of the inner ear to the outer ear.
- You should have two cat ears with inner ears and two without.




STEP 5 — Assemble the Ears

- Put one ear without the inner ear down furry-side-up.
- Put one ear with the inner ear furry-side-down on top of the ear from Step A, so the furry sides are touching. Match the edges.
- Pin the ears together.
- Sew along the edges of the ear. Leave the bottom open.
- Repeat for the other ear.
- Flip both ears right-side-out. (You're almost finished!)




STEP 6 — Stuff the Ears

- Stuff the ears with a little bit of batting.
- Sew the bottoms of the ears closed, leaving the two rectangular flaps unsewn.



STEP 7 — Wrap the Headband

- Run a line of glue down the edge of the headband.
- Starting on one end, wrap the ribbon around the headband until it is completely covered.
- Sew the bottom of each ear closed, leaving a small loop at the bottom of each. The loop should be big enough for the headband to slide through.



STEP 8 — Attach the Ears

- Slide the ears over the headband.
- Use glue to secure the ears to the headband once they are positioned.

STUFF YOU NEED:

Cardstock
Glue stick
Glitter
Chain or yarn



MEDALLION — INSTRUCTIONS

STEP 1 — Print on cardstock; cut out.

STEP 2 — Trace the logo with glue stick; then, sprinkle with black glitter.

STEP 3 — Add chain (or yarn).









PAW






STEP 1 — Print and Cut

- Print out the pattern pieces. Check that your hand fits into the paw print template. (If it doesn't, place your hand on the fabric and draw your own paw around it.)
- Cut out each shape.



STEP 2 — Trace Pattern for Paw Base


- Fold the orange fabric, pressing the furry sides together.
- On the back of the fabric, trace both the right and the left paw base patterns.
- Use the X-ACTO® blade to cut the paw bases out, using the line as your guide.
- Set the paws aside. You should have four pieces total (a front and a back to each paw).



STEP 3 — Cut Paw Pads

- Pin the paw pad templates to the pink fabric.
- Cut the pads out with your scissors.
- There will be 10 pieces: eight ovals and two heart shapes.


Pro Tip:
Pin your pattern to the fur before tracing/cutting. You can use scissors, but they will cut both the fur and the backing.



STEP 4 — Pin and Sew the Paw Pads


- Pin the paw pads to the furry side of the paw base for each hand.
- Sew the edges of the pads to the paw base.
- You should have two paw bases with paw pads and two without.

Pro Tip:
If you have access to a sewing machine, use a zigzag stitch to go along the edge of your paw pads.



STEP 5 — Make the Claws

- Pin the triangle claw templates to the black fabric.
- Cut the claws out with your scissors. There will be eight claws.
- Fold the claws with the shiny side of the fabric together and the long edges touching.
- Sew the sides together, leaving the bottom open.



STEP 6 — Assemble the Paws

- Put one paw without paw pads down furry-side-up.
- Place four claws for that paw on each paw finger with the pointy part of the claw facing the center of the paw.
- Pin the claws in place.
- Put one paw with paw pads furry-side-down on top of the paw from Step A, so the furry sides are touching. Match the edges.
- Pin the paws together.
- Sew along the edges of the paw. Leave the bottom open as well as 3 inches on either side of the wrist.
- Repeat with the other paw.
- Flip both paws right-side-out.
