- <u>Kauai Humane Society</u> of Kauai, Hawaii is leveraging Scooter[™] in direct mail, digital ads and radio public service announcements to help increase spay/neutering on their island which suffers from a significant overpopulation problem.
- People Assisting Animal Control (PAAC) of Corpus Christi, Texas is leveraging Scooter™ in their digital advertising and social media.
